**Judge Laurance B. VanMeter** was elected to the Kentucky Court of Appeals in 2003 to serve Division 1 of the 5th Appellate District. Judge VanMeter currently serves as Court of Appeals representative on the Ethics Committee of the Kentucky Judiciary. He also has served as a Fayette County District and Circuit Judge.

**Luke Morgan, J.D.**, is an associate at McBrayer, McGinnis, Leslie & Kirkland, PLLC, in Lexington, where he focuses on the areas of criminal law, administrative law, government relations, and litigation. He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky (JD). Mr. Morgan also has served as Assistant Fayette County Commonwealth's Attorney, Assistant Attorney General, and General Counsel to the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet.

**Judge James Keller (Ret.)** joined the Lexington law firm of Gess Mattingly & Atchison in 2005, after having retired as an Associate Justice on the Kentucky Supreme Court and having previously served for 22 years as Circuit Judge for Fayette County. Justice Keller served two terms as the Chief Circuit Judge and volunteered as a Drug Court Judge. He was twice elected President of the Kentucky Circuit Judges Association.

**Justice Mary Noble** was elected to the Supreme Court of Kentucky in 2006 to serve the 5th Supreme Court District. She previously was a Fayette County Circuit Judge and served two terms as Chief Regional Circuit Judge. Justice Noble is one of the founders of Kentucky Drug Courts and served as a Drug Court judge from 1996 to 2006.

**Judge Glenn Acree** was elected judge for the Kentucky Court of Appeals in 2006 to serve Division 2 of the 5th Appellate District. Before his appointment to the Court of Appeals, Judge Acree handled litigation and appeals in the areas of criminal law, administrative law, employment discrimination, civil procedure, insurance law, domestic relations, environmental law and construction law.

**Judge Kimberly Bunnell** has served as judge for the Fayette County Circuit Court, 9th Division, since 2000. She previously served as an assistant Fayette County attorney and also supervised the Repeat Offender Prosecution Enforcement program.

**Judge Thomas L. Clark** serves as Chief Regional Circuit Judge, and presides over the 8th Division. He is a past-president of the Kentucky Circuit Judges Association.

**Judge Pamela Goodwine** has served the Fayette County Circuit Court, 4th Division since 1999. She became chief regional district judge in 2002. Prior to her appointment she practiced law in the areas of commercial litigation, labor and employment, tort and insurance law.

**Judge James D. Ishmael, Jr.** has served as judge for the Fayette County Circuit Court, 3rd Division, since 2004. He presides over civil and criminal dockets. He previously practiced as a trial attorney for 31 years.
